LABUAN: A giant green sea turtle was found dead without its head and tail at Layang-Layangan beach, here, on Monday.

The 1.16-metre female from the most endangered and threatened species of sea turtle was found by a villager and children who were playing on the beach around 9 am.

The discovery was reported to Bernama journalist Jailani Hasan who then notified the fisheries Department at 10.24 am.

The department's marine park and resource management tranch head, Vanessa Caroline Lee who arrived at the scene said this was the second discovery after a hawksbill turtle (Eretmochelys imbricata) was found dead on Chinney beach on Sept 6.



"Nelayan asing ini tertarik dengan perairan Pulau Pinang kerana kaya dengan hasil laut seperti lkan senangin, kembong, tenggiri, tongkoj dan bawal.
