Lima penternak rugi RM800,000 apabila 40 tan ikan mati

Hm m/s 11 3/3/2022

Hulu Terengganu: Lima penternak di Kampung Kubang Palas, Kuala Tememong dekat sini kerugian lebih RM800,000 apabila 40 tan ikan air tawar yang diternak mati susulan banjir Ahad lalu.

Ikan tilapia, patin dan baung yang diusahakan Mohd Dzul Faizal Mazlan, 38, Zainal Abidin Endut, 41, Mohamad Ridzwan Endut, 27, Mohd Faizal Endut, 32 dan Sabri Endut, 39, mati dipercayai akibat air terlalu deras dan berlumpur.

Mohd Dzul Faizal berkata, dia hanya mampu lizat sebanyak 54 sangkar ikan dilanggar air deras ketika kejadian itu.

"Ada sangkar ikan penternak lain dari Kuala Berang yang dihanyutkan arus deras dan merempuh sang-

kar ikan kami menyebabkan sangkar ikan itu mengalami kerosakan teruk.

"Luluh hati melihat semua ikan mati kerana fenomena banjir kali ini. Kami kehilangan pendapatan kerana semua ikan diternak mati dan tidak boleh dijual," katanya ketika ditemui di sangkar ikannya hari ini.

Zainal berkata, sepatutnya sebanyak 10 tan ikan boleh dijual daripada sangkar ikannya itu pada Ramadan tahun ini.

"Boleh dikatakan penawaran ikan air tawar di negeri ini akan terjejas teruk pada tahun ini kerana ramai penternak ikan yang terjejas.

"Sekarang ikan sudah mati, kami terima dengan hati yang terbuka, cuma masalah sekarang kos me-

nguruskan bangkai ikan yang mati pun besar kerana ia perlu ditanam," katanya.

Katanya, kos untuk membaik pulih sangkar yang rosak itu juga besar dan berharap bantuan pihak bertanggungjawab.

"Paling kurang kami perlukan RM200,000 untuk membaik pulih 54 petak sangkar ikan yang rosak.

"Kos memasukkan benih ikan baharu juga besar iaitu sebanyak RM20,000," katanya.

Sabri berkata, dia berharap keprihatinan semua pihak untuk membantu penternak yang terjejas kerana fenomena banjir itu.

"Kami memang memerlukan bantuan daripada semua pihak untuk kembali menternak seperti biasa," katanya.

Penceroboh songlap rezeki nelayan

SUNGAI PETANI - Kira-kira 1,000 nelayan mendesak pihak berkuasa supaya mengambil tindakan tegas dan menangkap mereka yang melakukan pencerobohan bot pukat tunda dan rawa sorong di perairan Kuala Muda dan Yan di sini.

Penceroohan itu bukan sahaja menjejaskan sumber pendapatan nelayan di pangkalan Teluk Nipah, Amboi, Pulau Sayak dan Tanjung Dawai dekat sini, malah menyebabkan benih ikan, udang, ketam dan lain-lain musnah.

Presiden Persatuan Pengguna Pulau Pinang (CAP), Mohideen Abdul Kader berkata, pencerobohan semakin serius hingga menyebabkan nelayan hanya memperoleh RM40 sehari berbanding RM200 sebelum ini.

Katanya, nelayan rugi hampir puluhan ribu ringgit kerana peralatan menangkap ikan musnah dilanggar bot-bot tersebut.

Kedah manakala bot pukat rawa sorong dan bubu naga dipercayai dari Yan.

"Mereka bergiat aktif di Pulau Bidan, Tanjung Jaga dan Singkir antara pukul 12 tengah malam hingga 6 pagi sejauh 100 meter hingga empat kilometer dari pantai," katanya dalam kenyataan di sini semalam.

Menurut Abdul Kader, nelayan dan CAP telah beberapa kali membuat aduan kepada

pihak berkuasa tetapi tiada sebarang tindakan yang berkesan diambil.

Sehubungan itu beliau mengesahkan Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Jabatan Perikanan Kedah dan Maritim Malaysia supaya campur tangan dan menjalankan siasatan berkaitan isu tersebut.

Sementara itu, seorang nelayan, Amin Abdul Hamid, 43, berkata, nelayan di sini mungkin akan terputus sumber mata pencarian tidak lama lagi sekiranya pihak berkuasa tidak mengambil tindakan.

Seorang lagi nelayan, Mukhlis Mansor, 36, pula memberitahu, dia kecewa kerana pihak berkuasa gagal mengambil tindakan bagi membanteras aktiviti haram tersebut.

"Saya hairan setiap kali aduan dibuat, nelayan yang menjalankan aktiviti haram ini akan menghentikan operasi mereka serta-merta mungkin disebabkan berlaku kebocoran maklumat," dakwanya.

Isu nelayan diselesaikan

LKIM, MAFI anjur sesi Dialog Industri Agromakanan 2022 di Endau

Lembaga Kemajuan Ikan Malaysia (LKIM) dengan kerjasama Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan (MAFI) menganjurkan Jelajah Dialog Industri Agromakanan 2022 di Kompleks Perikanan LKIM Endau, di sini pada Selasa.

Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee berkata, jelajah dialog itu merupakan lanjutan daripada sesi yang dilaksanakan bagi proses libat urus bersama pemain industri di semua sektor dan subsektor di bawah Kementerian tersebut.

Beliau berkata, beberapa isu berkaitan nelayan di negeri Johor juga berjaya diselesaikan dalam program tersebut termasuk masalah perlesenan.

"Seramai 126 nelayan kelas A diberikan lesen hari ini selepas satu proses pemutihan yang dilakukan untuk kawasan Endau dan negeri Johor keseluruhannya.

"Ini merupakan pendekatan baharu yang dibuat oleh MAFI iaitu membuat proses pemutihan untuk mendafatkan dan memberikan lesen baharu kepada nelayan tulen yang juga nelayan sepenuh masa," katanya ketika ditemui pemberita selepas

menjadi panel dalam program tersebut pada Selasa.

Turut diadakan pada program dialog berkenaan acara Karnival Jualan My Best Buy oleh Lembaga Pemasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (FAMA), Lelungan Ayam PPN oleh Pertubuhan Peladang Kawasan (PPK) Endau; Pustur Bergerak Lembaga Kemajuan Ikan Malaysia (LKIM) dan Jualan Ikan Segar oleh Persatuan Nelayan Kawasan Endau serta Sodih.

Dalam pada itu, Ronald berkata, secara keseluruhan seramai lebih kurang 3,000 nelayan baharu telah dipilih dan ditawarkan lesen tulen di seluruh negara menerusi proses pemutihan setakat ini.

Menjawab soalan mengenai tuntutan kenaikan elaun sara hidup daripada RM300 kepada RM500 untuk setiap nelayan, Ronald Kiandee bagaimanapun berkata cadangan itu akan dikaji oleh kerajaan untuk menentukannya.

Sementara itu, Ketua Pengarah LKIM, Yusoff Othman yang juga panel dalam dialog itu berkata, pengumuman acara tersebut amat penting untuk diadakan kerana ia dapat memudahkan usaha kerajaan menyelesaikan isu dihadapi nelayan.

"Ia memudahkan LKIM

untuk menyelesaikan masalah melalui persatuan nelayan di kawasan masing-masing.

"Mana-mana masalah kita akan salurkan kepada persatuan nelayan. Ini bermakna penyelesaian kepada kumpulan sasar juga mudah dilaksanakan," ujarnya.

Terdahulu, program tersebut turut menyaksikan pemberian bantuan 'touch point' peralatan tangkapan ikan kepada 70 nelayan di kawasan Endau, Mersing dan Tanjung Piai serta Bantuan Yayasan Nelayan Malaysia (YANEM) 'Back to School' kepada 50 anak-anak ahli persatuan nelayan.

Turut disampaikan ialah lesen simpan khas kepada 126 penerima yang terdiri daripada nelayan laut kawasan Mersing dan Endau serta bantuan peralatan menangkap ikan kepada 31 penerima nelayan darat dengan peruntukan sebanyak RM12,400 daripada Jabatan Perikanan Malaysia (DOF).

Pada masa sama, Geran Agropreneur Muda turut diberikan kepada empat agropreneur Negeri Johor dan 350 penerima Bantuan MAFI Prihatin serta satu penerima dibawah Program PENJANA Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar berjumlah RM20,000.

Halang pencerobohan bot pukat tunda

Lebih 1,000 nelayan di Kuala Muda gesa pihak berkuasa ambil tindakan tegas

Lebih 1,000 nelayan di daerah Kuala Muda di sini memohon pihak berkuasa meningkatkan penguatkuasaan bagi menghalang pencerobohan yang menjejaskan pendapatan mereka.

Nelayan, Amin Abdul Hamid, 43, berkata, penguatkuasaan perlu dikenakan lebih tegas ke atas pihak yang menggunakan pukat tunda, rawa sorong dan bubu naga secara haram sehingga menjejaskan nelayan dari pangkalan Teluk Nipah, Teluk Amboi, Pulau Sayak dan Tanjung Dawal.

Menurutnya, pencerobohan dikesan bermula sekitar jam 12 tengah malam hingga 6 pagi meliputi kawasan antara 100 meter hingga empat kilometer dari pesisiran pantai termasuk di sekitar Pulau Bidan, Tanjung Jaga dan Singkar.

"Kegiatan pencerobohan boleh menyebabkan kepupusan hidupan laut seperti benih ikan, udang, ketam dan lain-lain akibat penggunaan peralatan terlarang.

"Ada nelayan yang hanya dapat RM40 setiap kali turun ke laut berbanding dulu sekitar

RM200 setelah tangkapan hasil laut berkurangan," jelasnya.

Menurut Amin, terdapat nelayan yang menanggung kerugian berpuluh ribu ringgit akibat alat tangkapan rosak dilanggar penceroboh.

Seorang lagi nelayan,

Mukhlis Mansor, 36, mendakwa, masalah itu sudah dilaporkan beberapa kali, namun ia masih berlaku.

Katanya, tindakan membanteras selain hukuman yang setimpal perlu dikenakan ke atas pelaku bagi mengekang perbuatan terbahit.

Masalah itu turut mendapat perhatian Persatuan Pengguna Pulau Pinang (CAP) yang menggesa kementerian berkaitan campur tangan bagi menyasat perkara berkenaan.

Presiden CAP, Mohideen Abdul Kader berkata, pencerobohan boleh menyebabkan kepupusan sumber, menggugat sektor perikanan dan memberi kesan terhadap ekonomi negara pada masa akan datang.

Menurutnya, aktiviti itu juga menyebabkan ribuan metrik tan benih ikan musnah setiap hari.

"Masalah yang disuarakan oleh nelayan di Kuala Muda bukanlah isu baharu malah keadaan ini masih berlarutan hingga kini," katanya.

Fishermen in choppy waters

Unpredictable weather puts Gelang Patah community's livelihood at risk

FROM time immemorial, fishermen in Johor have relied on their knowledge of the weather, including the phases of the moon and tides, before going out to sea.

Faidarus Abd Rahim, 40, recalled when he first became a coastal fisherman at the age of 20, he learned from veteran fishermen how to study weather patterns.

"This knowledge has been passed down from father to son and most of the time, it has proven to be useful," he said when met at Kampung Pendas Laut in Gelang Patah, Johor.

Faidarus said he had become better over the years through personal experience at gauging the best time to head out to sea.

"We look at the moon, stars and wind patterns to determine if we will land a good catch.

"Fishes usually search for food at sunrise and sunset. They are active for one to two

hours when the sun rises and when it sets.

"So, these are the best times for us to fish," he said.

However, he lamented that over the years, climate change had thrown weather patterns in disarray hence affecting fishermen's livelihoods.

"In the past, I could easily bring home about 30kg of fish after three to four hours at sea but now my catch has dropped by almost half," said Faidarus.

He said fishermen now had to go out 20km further to land a better catch, unlike previously when they could fish about 5km from the village.

Fellow fisherman Haron Basim said even the crab population in the waters of Gelang Patah had dwindled drastically in the past decade.

"I used to get 40kg of flower crabs. Now, I consider myself lucky if I can get 3kg," he said.

Grappling with changing patterns

Haron said there were days when the seawater was at the right temperature, not too warm or too cold, for fish to come closer to the shore.

He said squid season used to be from February to April but it had since changed to May to July.

As for catching prawns, he said September used to be a fruitful time but their season had shifted to January for the past two years.

The 63-year-old, who has been a fisherman for 36 years, said coastal development projects in the Gelang Patah area had contributed to the dwindling marine life.

"Years ago, there was an oil spill from a ship in waters off Gelang Patah and fishermen could not go out to sea for three months," said Haron.

Former fisherman Ismail Md Said, 72, said 30 minutes to an hour before the sun rises was the best time for fishermen as fishes were active during that period.

"They feed in a frenzy and most

of them end up in our nets," said Ismail who became a fisherman when he was 13 years old.

He said the feeding frenzy peaked during full moon or a new

moon and normally fishermen would land a good catch during this time.

Ismail, who called it a day in 1984 but still regularly meets with

fellow fishermen at Kampung Pendas Laut, has noticed that their catch is getting less.

"Now they depend on luck," he said.

COASTAL fishermen are facing constant challenges due to climate change and vast development projects coming up in the southern-most parts of Johor.

ISEAS-Yusof Ishak Institute Singapore visiting fellow Dr Serina Rahman said climate change had resulted in more extreme weather phenomena like fierce storms and heatwaves.

"This has a direct effect on fishermen's ability to head out to sea," she said in an interview at Kampung Pendas Laut in Gelang Patah.

She said severe storms put the fishermen at greater risk when at sea and often, they had to turn back. Sometimes, they cannot head out at all.

Those using small boats cannot risk their life heading out to sea when weather conditions are not on their side.

Serina said this problem had compromised their livelihoods because of fewer days spent at sea.

The storms are also harder to predict these days. "Our research on weather conditions (with input from coastal fishermen) reveals that the wind can change direction many times a day," she added.

In the past, winds were constant (if westerlies, then steady winds blow from the west for a few days). Now, however, the wind direction can change in a day.

"Fishermen can head out in fine weather but get hit by an unexpected

ed storm while they are away from shore," said Serina.

Accidents caused by large waves are happening more frequently and monsoon surges do not follow long-held patterns.

"Nothing is predictable anymore. More frequent rain also affects water quality. The rain increases nutrients from run-off, causing the growth of unwanted algae in the water," Serina explained.

"The algae affects the fisherman's catch and damages nets.

"Fishermen normally repair damaged nets every month; now they

have to perform this task every two to three weeks," she added.

The ever-changing seawater temperature also had a direct impact on marine life, said Serina.

"Marine creatures do not like these different temperatures," she said, citing as example that in very cold weather, crabs seem to disappear.

She said the movements of marine species had changed too.

Fishermen now find it harder to read the seasons and weather.

South Johor Fishermen Association chairman Azli Mond

AZLI said there were good days and bad days for them.

"Sometimes, our catch is bountiful and sometimes, it is not worth going out to sea," he said.

He added that the weather, tides and water temperature seemed to change every other day.

Another major factor impacting the income of fishermen in recent years is development taking place in south Johor.

Azli lamented that large-scale land reclamation projects along the shoreline had shrunk their fishing zones.

"Our income has declined by more than half in the past five or six years due to land reclamation for multi-billion-ringgit waterfront property projects."

He said the fishermen's operating cost was also going up year by year as they needed to replace damaged nets and maintain their boats including the engine.

"Buying a boat is costly. Previously, a 20ft fibre boat would cost about RM12,000 but now, the price has shot up to RM20,000," said Azli.

There are about 3,500 coastal fishermen in south Johor and their fishing areas within 10 nautical miles cover Tanjung Piai, Iskandar Puteri, Pulau, Johor Baru, Pasir Gudang and Tebrau.
